Rehearsals began in October for the annual SHADDO Pantomime, to be staged at Shiplake Memorial Hall on the 6th, 7th and 8th February. This year's show is Ali Baba, and the 40-strong cast includes some new faces as well as those familiar from previous shows.



Our previous three pantomimes have all come from the same script writers – this year we've chosen a script from a different source, but it still has all the traditional panto elements: a good story, colourful characters, lots of jokes, songs and plenty of audience participation! And, like last year, there will be three evening performances and a Saturday matinee specially adapted for younger children. Tickets will go on sale on 2nd January at The Corner Shop, Lower Shiplake and The Binfield Heath Stores. There's always strong demand, especially for the Saturday evening performance, so get there early!

As always, the cast is supported by a hard-working team of SHADDO members and supporters who are busy assembling costumes and props, designing the set, planning the lighting, sound effects and music, not to mention organising seating, publicity, ticket sales, programmes, licences and all the other stuff that has to be done. Kreepy Kenton Kapers



Passers-by at the Kenton Theatre on the evening of Saturday, November 26th, stopped in their tracks as they heard wailing, howling, creaking and frenzied laughter emanating from the rear of the building- was this the latest production of 'The House of Commons', Neil George getting into his Dame costume or Liz James suddenly realising how many days were left until the first Panto performance?

No, it was the third performance of the Murder Mystery - The Curse of Castle Dracula - by SHADDO, at the HAODS (Henley Amateur Operatic and Drama Society) social evening.

An audience of c. 50 were regaled by the scary cast of Ivan Evenstitch (Nigel Piercey), Romany Gerimov (Hilary Tucker), Dr Frankenstein (Mark Manson), Baroness Bliekhardt (Lizzie Thomas), Fraulein Von Sternhandling (Angela Jones), Herr Munster (Neil George), Klina Kytczinzinka (Liz James) and the host, Count Dracula (Neil McAdam).....oh, and the unexpected guest Dr. Jock McClew (Gareth Jones). The sound effects (e.g. screams of friendless lunatics) were controlled by 'mine's a pint' Hugh Steele and the very effective lighting by Tristan Jones.

HAODS generously gave us the freedom of their extensive wardrobe (although Herr Munster may regret having chosen the wig he did!) and we created a simple but effective set on a raised dais that transformed the Kenton's Green Room into Castle Dracula for the evening. The HAODS 'villagers' played a full part in the proceedings (you could tell that they were out to enjoy themselves) with a mixture of inventive questioning and good-natured heckling.

An excellent meal was provided by HAODS, who were very pleased with the event, which helped to raise some funds for the society. They are already looking to book us again for another murder mystery night - pasta anyone?

This has certainly helped to cement relations between HAODS and SHADDO, with beneficial spin-offs already materialising. Our thanks to Julie Huntington and all at HAODS for a very enjoyable evening and to Gareth and Angela for organising/scripting, as well as the cast for their excellent performance.
